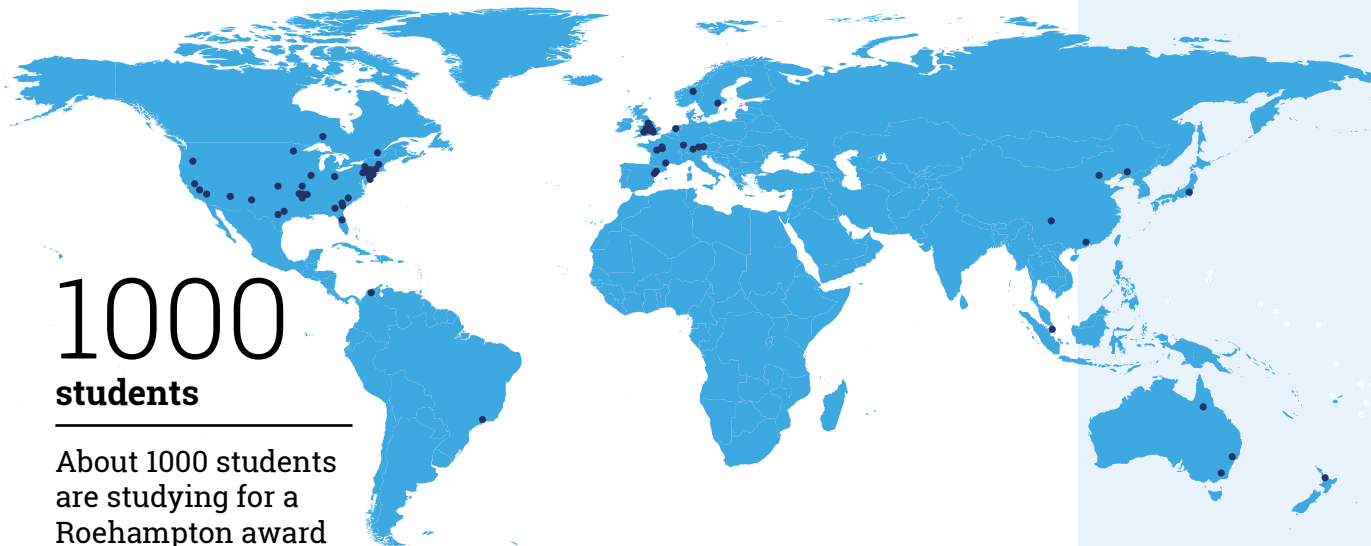

The University Partnerships Office

The University Partnerships Office plays a central role in developing innovative partnerships with educational partners across the world. We aim to help you by:

1. Holding initial discussions to explore partnership opportunities
2. Facilitating talks with academic departments
3. Taking forward the partnerships approval process

We will be with you every step of the way, coordinating the lines of communication to ensure the smooth running of operations.



Types of partnership

The University has a wide portfolio of collaborative arrangements through which it delivers learning opportunities with external organisations.

Validation

A process by which the University evaluates a module or programme developed and delivered by another organisation and approves it as being of an appropriate standard and quality to contribute or lead to one of its awards. Students could be registered with the University, the partner institution or both. The University maintains responsibility for the quality and standards of the award.

Franchise


An arrangement where the University approves an institution to deliver part or all of one (or more) of its own approved programmes. The University retains direct responsibility for the programme content, the teaching and assessment strategy, the assessment regime and quality assurance, and maintains responsibility for the quality and standards of the award. Students could be registered with the University, the partner institution or both.

Articulation agreement

A process whereby all students who satisfy academic criteria on one programme are automatically entitled (on academic grounds) to be admitted with advanced standing to a subsequent stage of a programme of the University. These arrangements normally involve credit accumulation and transfer, so that credit achieved for the approved study at the first provider can be transferred to contribute to the programme and award completed at the University. The two separate components are the responsibility of the respective organisations delivering them but, together, contribute to a single award of the University. Students normally have a contractual relationship with the organisation which delivers the first component and subsequently with the University. Advance standing is when the applicant enters a University validated programme later than the stage, level or year than that to which a student with a normal entry qualification may be admitted. Students can enter a programme with previous qualifications or other accreditation of prior experiential learning, where this learning is mapped towards the University programme and it has been established that the learning outcomes, content, currency, academic credit and level of the award are appropriate and relevant. Advanced standing can be awarded for a full level or part level and this denotes the point of entry to the programme.

Joint award

An arrangement under which two or more awarding bodies together provide a programme leading to a single award made jointly by both or all participants. A single certificate or document attests to the successful completion of this jointly delivered programme, replacing the separate institutional or national qualifications.

Dual award

An arrangement where the University has entered into collaboration with another organisation that either has its own degree-awarding powers or is accredited by an external degree-awarding body. This may involve a joint curriculum or independent but equivalent curricula followed by separate blocks of study, leading to two separate qualifications awarded by the two degree-awarding bodies.

Placement learning

Arrangements whereby the University agrees with external partner(s) regarding the provision of an off-site environment (for example, in the workplace), wherein some of the learning leading to an award made by the University takes place. The external partner(s) may be involved in the assessment process.

Study abroad

An arrangement whereby students from partner institutions from outside the UK study at the University for a period of time, often a semester or during the summer, and the credit achieved is accepted at the students' home institution. Roehampton may also be able to customise these programmes to better meet our partners' requirements. Partnerships may involve a fee-paying arrangement or a reciprocal exchange.
